

Improving bus services in Norfolk

In August 2022 Norfolk County Council was awarded £49.55m of funding from the Department for Transport (DfT) to improve bus services across the county over three years. Here is an overview of what has been achieved so far (up to and including November 2023)

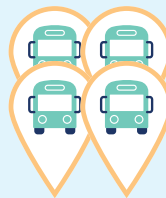

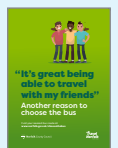
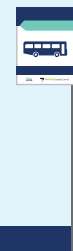
